While second in command at the DA's Office, Greg brought an innovative justice program called "Drug Court" to Utah. The first therapeutic justice program established in the state, Drug Court has been a tremendously successful model for similar programs such as the Mental Health Court, Misdemeanor Drug Court and SLC Domestic Violence Court. Greg was also Utah's first gang prosecutor. He helped establish the Salt Lake Area Gang Project in 1990 at a time when many did not believe Salt Lake City even had a "gang problem."
